Horseshow management: The Horse Show Management reserves the right in itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interest of the show and its exhibitors. Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, contractors, sponsoring entities and facility harmless for any loss or accident to horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino-pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. All horses must have valid proof of negative coggins test (within 12 months). A 30 day certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Ohio. THIS WILL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THIS SHOW OR SHOW GROUNDS.

Closing Dates: Stall counts must be received 7 days before the show. Full payment required of stall fee and shavings if ordered to secure stalls. After closing date, stalls are not refundable. Reserve stalls and Create your entries at www.horseshowing.com. There is a charge of \$1 per show day or \$25 per year to use this service. Entries can be emailed to <a href="mailto:nesthorseshows@gmail.com">nesthorseshows@gmail.com</a> no later that 5 days to the show date. Due to mail service mailing entries are not accepted at this time.

Adding Classes: Same day adds may not be allowed, always enter the day before the classes are scheduled.

Scratching Classes This MUST BE DONE IN THE SHOW OFFICE on an official add/scratch slip. Full credit will be given for any classes scratched before the start of the class. Informing the starter that you do not intend to participate does not get you scratched in the office and will not qualify for a refund.

Non-Showing Horses: Any horse non showing in a class or division of the show will be charged a non-showing fee listed on price sheet per show.

Schooling: YOU MUST WEAR YOUR NUMBER WHILE RIDING IN TICKETED SCHOOLING. Jumping in the show rings without permission is prohibited at all times. Warm up jumps are provided in designated schooling rings.

Awards: Ribbons will be presented thru 6<sup>th</sup> place.

Check Out: All entries must be completed prior to horse and rider leaving. If a blank check is left on file we will email/text you the amount your check was written for.

Payment Method: Check\cash\CC

Returned Checks: Returned checks are subject to a \$50 NSF fee and \$25 Admin Fee.

Refunds: No refunds available at this time.

Office Hours: The office will open 1 hour prior to the start of the show each day and close after the show has concluded.

Stabling: 10' X 12' permanent stalls with stall doors, the floors are screenings with rubber mats and 10' x 10' temporary stalls on concrete with rubber mats. Stalls for horses \$100.00 and must be prepaid. Stalls will not be confirmed without a payment. Temporary stabling 10' x 10' of vinyl construction with doors and under canvas will be used for additional stabling if necessary. Stalls in the permanent barns (permanent or temporary) will be reserved first come first served. Initial bedding will not be provided. Any stall not occupied by a horse will be considered as at Tack Stall and billed at \$175.00

A \$60.00 Haul-In fee will be charged for all competitors showing out of their trailer. All horses will have either a stall fee or haul-in fee. Exhibitors must check in at the show office before schooling/showing. All horses not stabled on show grounds will be charged a haul in fee.

Aisles: Social distancing MUST be taken seriously back at the barns and kept to 10 people or less in group gatherings

Feed and Bedding: Bedding available for \$8 per back pre reserved by June 1st. No straw allowed.

Entry Closing: Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the Horse Show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee and class placing.

Rings: All of the Brave Horse Show Park's five, state-of-the-art arenas are dressed with Footing First's scientifically tested proprietary blend of SRS footing. Grand Prix Ring 340 x 240, Hunter Ring I 250 x 150, Hunter Ring II 250 x 150, Annex Ring 240 x 150.

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to

others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Dogs: Dog owners failing to comply with this rule must/will be issued a Yellow warning card by the steward or any competition official. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds at any time and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behavior.

Medical Waste: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste container will be provided in the stable area. Failure to use them will result in a \$100 fine per needle found. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of medical waste. PLEASE DO NOT MIX NEEDLES WITH THE MANURE OR TRASH!

Protective Headgear: ALL EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR ASTM APPROVED HEADGEAR AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED. It is required when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured.

Poling: Manual poling and use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times while on the show grounds. Exhibitors found in violation will forfeit all entry fees for that showing day or day afterwards

#### **HUNTER DIVSIONS**

#### PERFORMANCE HUNTER

Open to all horses. No restrictions by previous show history. Fence height 3'3" to 3'6".

#### AMATEUR-OWNER DIVISION

Open to horses ridden by an amateur owner or an amateur member of the owner's family, eighteen years of age and older. Fence height - 3'3" to 3'6"

# JUNIOR HUNTER DIVISION

Open to horses ridden by a junior exhibitor. Fence height - 3'6". May be combined with Junior Hunter 3'3", if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, and no fence height is reported, points earned will be awarded towards year end standings in the Junior Hunter 3'3" division.

GREEN WORKING HUNTER

This division is set at the following height options, 3'0", 3'3", 3'6", and 3'9" as defined by USEF. Only one OHJA end-of-the-year award will be given in this division. All four heights must be offered at horse shows, and the winners will be determined by all heights being judged together. Our previous pre-green division now is included under this umbrella of green hunter

# OHJA THOROUGHBRED HUNTER 3'0"

Open to 'Thoroughbred' horses that are in possession of Breed Registry papers. All horse shows must require riders to verify registration on the day of the horse show through one of the following methods: The Jockey Club Certificate of Foal Registration or lip tattoo with the 5-cross pedigree and a successful tattoo lookup from The Jockey Club's Tattoo Identification Services (located at www.registry.jockeyclub.com). If neither of the above is available a letter from The Jockey Club verifying the horse's identity is acceptable. Fences set at 2'6" or 3'0". Spreads not to exceed fence height. Cross entry into other sections is allowed. If a 2'6" and 3'0" section is offered for this division at the same show an individual horse may only accumulate points in one of the sections

#### LOW HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies in any classification of showing. Fence height - 3'0".

# CHILDREN'S HUNTER

To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1 of the current competition year. Cross Entry: Riders entered in Children's Hunter Horse sections may not compete in any other class in which the obstacles exceed 3'5" at the same competition (exception: Equitation classes up to 3'9", Jumper classes 1.20m and lower, Junior Hunter sections, USHJA National Hunter Derby Classic and USHJA International Hunter Derby). A Children's Hunter Horse rider may only compete one different horse in the Junior Hunter Sections. A Junior Hunter rider may only compete one different horse in the Children's Hunter Horse section. Horses entered in Children's Hunter classes may not cross enter into Junior Hunter sections at the same competition. Riders entered in the Children's Hunter Horse section may only compete on one Children's Hunter Pony at the same competition

#### ADULT HUNTER

To be ridden by Amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. Riders may not compete in any other classes at the same competition where fences exceed 3'3", except the Adult Amateur Jumper and Amateur Owner Hunter. Any rider showing in the Amateur Owner Hunter division may compete 1 different horse in the Adult Amateur Hunter division and must own or have an USEF registered lease of said horse. Fences to be set between 2'9" to 3'0"; spreads not to exceed fence height. Ponies may be shown by Adults, suitability to count. Entries need not be jogged for soundness. An unrestricted Children's/Adult Hunter division may be offered

# **BABY GREEN**

A Baby Green Hunter is a horse or pony of any age in it's first or second year of showing at 2'6", and has never competed over fences higher than 2'6". A horse is eligible for the OHJA year-end awards for either or both of two consecutive years. Once a horse has shown in the Pre-Green Hunter division, it may no longer compete in the Baby Green Hunter division.

#### SPECIAL HUNTER

Open to all horses and ponies. Fence height - 2'6"

#### INTERMEDIATE ADULT HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies ridden by adult riders who are considered amateurs according to USEF rules. Cross Entry: Rider may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where the fences exceed 2'9" (Exception: 3'0" Equitation). Height of Fences: 2'6"

#### INTERMEDIATE CHILD DIVISION

Intermediate Children's Hunter Division. Open to horses and ponies ridden by junior riders according to USEF rules. Cross Entry: Riders may not cross-enter at the same show into the Children's Hunter, Pony Hunter or any class/section where fences exceed 2'9" (Exception: 3'0" Equitation). Height of Fences: 2'6".

#### **NEST VERY GREEN HUNTER**

Open to all horses and ponies. Fence height  $-2^{\circ}3^{\circ}$ 

# **NEST NON PRO 2'3"**

Open to all horses and ponies. Except Professionals. Fence height – 2'3"

#### CHILDREN'S PONY HUNTER

Open to ponies ridden by a Junior Exhibitor. Riders may not cross enter into any classes in which fences exceed 3'3" at the same show, except Medal classes, age group equitation classes and Children's Jumper classes. Ponies may not compete in the Children's section if also entered in the pony division at the same show. The combination pony/rider is not eligible for USEF rated classes at the same show. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, and suitability as a Children's Hunter Pony. To be offered at two heights: fences 2' for small and medium and 2'6" for large ponies; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Ponies need not be jogged for soundness. No in and outs. Zone award will be presented annually as two sections: small/medium and large. If this division does not fill it may be combined with the Children's Hunter horse.

# **NEST BEGINNING HUNTER**

Open to all horses and riders. Fence height 2'0".

# **VERY LOW HUNTER NON-PRO**

Open to all horses and riders except for professionals. Fence height 2'0"

# SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies ridden by junior exhibitors eleven years of age and under. Limited to riders who have never shown over fences 2'6" or higher or in any pony hunter/jumper division. Fence height - 1'6" to 2'3".

#### LIMIT HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies ridden by exhibitors twelve years of age and over. Limited to riders who have never shown over fences 2'6" or higher or in any pony hunter/jumper division. Fence height - 1'6" to 2'3".

#### **FUTURE HUNTER**

Open to riders of any age or beginner horses or ponies that have never shown over 2'0". Fence height 1'6"-2'0".

#### UNRESTRICTED WALK TROT

Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders of all ages and any experience. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going

#### UNRESTRICTED CROSSRAILS

Open to horses and ponies ridden by riders of all ages and any experience. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going

# **EQUITATION DIVISIONS**

### WALK / TROT DIVISIONS

Open to riders of any age who have never shown over fences or in a class requiring them to canter (except Cross-Rail Equitation). Ground pole trotting is permitted.

# **CROSSRAIL EQUITATION**

Open to riders of any age who have not shown at a canter over a course of fences higher than 18". Trotting is not penalized. Cantering is permitted on the flat in small groups (five or less) only. Showing in this division does not affect a rider's eligibility for Walk/Trot Equitation. Riders may cross enter into future hunters at the same show providing the fence height does not exceed 18".

# SHORT STIRRUP/LIMIT RIDER EQUITAITION

Short Stirrup/Limit Rider Equitation. Open to riders eligible for the Short Stirrup and Limit Rider Divisions. Short Stirrup Equitation riders may cross-enter into the 11 and Under Equitation classes if it does not require them to jump 2'6" or higher. Fence height - 1'6" to 2'3" for both the Short Stirrup riders and for Limit Riders, no combinations.

# 11 YEARS AND UNDER EQUITATION

11 Years and Under Equitation. Fence height - 2'0" to 2'6", no combinations. Exception: ponies may jump their respective fence height.

# 12-14 YEARS EQUITATION

12 Through 14 Years Equitation. Effective February 1, 2018 fence height - 2'6" or 3'0". Exception: ponies may jump their respective fence height.

# 15-17 YEARS EQUITATION

15 Through 17 Years Equitation. Effective February 1, 2018 fence height - 3'0" to 3'6".

# **ADULT EQUITATION**

Adult Equitation. For adults eighteen years of age and over. Effective February 1, 2018 fence height - 3'0" or 3'6".

# INTERMEDIATE ADULT EQUITATION

Open to riders eligible for the Intermediate Adult Divisions. Fence height - 2'6". Cannot be combined with any other age group equitation. If this division is offered at the show, riders in this division may not cross enter into any other age group equitation division.

# INTERMEDIATE CHILD EQUITATION

Open to riders eligible for the Intermediate Children's Divisions. Fence height - 2'6". Cannot be combined with any other age group equitation. If this division is offered at the show, riders in this division may only cross enter into any other age group equitation division that does not require them to jump 2'6" or higher.

### CHILDRENS EQUITATION

Effective February 1, 2018. Fences: 3'0". Open to riders participating in children's hunters. May not cross enter into any divisions with fences higher than 3'3".

#### JUMPER DIVSIONS

### NOVICE CHILDREN'S / ADULT JUMPERS

Open to horses and riders who qualify for the children and adult jumper divisions. Fences 3'0".

### SCHOOLING/TRAINING JUMPER

Open to horses and ponies. Table II-2b is recommended but not required. In order for points to count if a high and low section is offered for this division at the same show an individual horse or pony may only compete in one of the sections. Fence height - 3'0" to 3'6" or 0.91m to 1.07m.

# LOW CHILDRENS/ADULT JUMPERS

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior or amateur rider. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any Junior or Amateur Owner Jumper section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into Low

Junior, Low Amateur Owner or Jumper section if offered on a different horse at the same show. Riders may not compete above 1.30m (4'3") in any open class at the same show. Sections may be divided by age of rider or by horse/pony, if so stated in the prize list. In order for points to count if a high and low section is offered for this division at the same show an individual horse or pony may only compete in one of the sections. Fences to be set at 3'0" to 3'3" or 0.91m to 1.00m. May be combined with High Children's/Adult Jumpers, if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, and no fence height is reported, points earned will be awarded towards year end standings in the Low division.

#### HIGH CHILDREN'S/ADULT JUMPERS

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior or amateur rider. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any Junior or Amateur Owner Jumper section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into Low Junior, Low Amateur Owner or Jumper section if offered on a different horse at the same show. Riders may not compete above 1.30m (4'3") in any open class at the same show. Sections may be divided by age of rider or by horse/pony, if so stated in the prize list. In order for points to count if a high and low section is offered for this division at the same show an individual horse or pony may only compete in one of the sections. Fences to be set at 3'3" to 3'6" or 1.00m to 1.07m. May be combined with Low Children's/Adult Jumpers, if entries warrant. If divisions are combined, and no fence height is reported, points earned will be awarded towards year end standings in the Low division.

#### INTERMEDIATE CHILDREN'S/ADULT JUMPERS

To be ridden by an intermediate junior or adult rider as defined by the intermediate children's and adult hunter division. Cross-entering into the Children's/Adult Jumper division on any horse at the same show is not allowed. Fence height - 2'6" to 2'9" or .77m to .83m.

#### JUNIOR A/O JUMPER

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior or amateur owner rider. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any Childrens or Adult Jumper section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into Children or Adult Jumper section if offered on a different horse at the same show. Sections may be divided by age of rider or by horse, if so stated in the prize list. In order for points to count if a high and low section is offered for this division at the same show an individual horse may only compete in one of the sections. Fences to be set at 3'9" to 4'6" or 1.15m to 1.35m

# THOROUGBRED DIVSIONS

\*PLEASE NOTE TIP classes may be run with their respective hunter division. You need to indicate to the steward your riding a TIP round. Failure to do so may result in loss of points for championship.

# The Jockey Club T.I.P. High Point Thoroughbred Hunter Award

Will be given to the Hunter Thoroughbred at the horse show accumulating the most points toward the award in Hunter classes. A high point ribbon will be provided for each award.

The Jockey Club T.I.P. Thoroughbred Cross Rails—12" and/or 18" at the Trot

(class or division). Ribbons for 1st through 6th place or a Champion/Reserve (as applicable) will be provided. **T.I.P. Championships division**.

# The Jockey Club T.I.P. Very Green Thoroughbred Hunter Division

Fences not to exceed 2'0" in height. Shall consist of three classes—two (2) over fences and one (1) under saddle. Jump courses should consist of at least seven (7) jumps, to be judged on manners, pace and way of going unless otherwise noted. Under saddle class to be judged at the walk, trot and canter in both directions, and to be judged on manners, movement and way of going. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for each class and Champion/Reserve ribbons will be provided. T.I.P. Championships division.

# The Jockey Club T.I.P. Beginning Thoroughbred Hunter Division

Fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. Shall consist of three classes—two (2) over fences and one (1) under saddle. Jump courses should consist of at least seven (7) jumps, to be judged on manners, pace and way of going unless otherwise noted. Under saddle class to be judged at the walk, trot and canter in both directions, and to be judged on manners, movement and way of going. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for each class and Champion/Reserve ribbons will be provided. T.I.P. Championships division.

# The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Special Thoroughbred Hunter Division**

Fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. Shall consist of three classes—two (2) over fences and one (1) under saddle. Jump courses should consist of at least seven (7) jumps, to be judged on manners, pace and way of going unless otherwise noted. Under saddle class to be judged at the walk, trot and canter in both directions, and to be judged on manners, movement and way of going. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for each class and Champion/Reserve ribbons will be provided. T.I.P. Championships division.

# The Jockey Club T.I.P. Low Thoroughbred Hunter Division

**Fences not to exceed 3'0" in height** (beginning in 2017). Shall consist of three classes—two (2) over fences and one (1) under saddle. Jump courses should consist of at least seven (7) jumps, to be judged on manners, pace and way of going unless otherwise noted. Under saddle class to be judged at the walk, trot and canter in both directions, and to be judged on manners, movement and way of going. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for each class and Champion/Reserve ribbons will be provided. **T.I.P. Championships division**.

NEW FOR 2020 The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Thoroughbred Debut Jumper I (2'3")**. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for 2 classes and a Champion/Reserve will be provided.

The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Thoroughbred Hopeful Jumper I (2'6")**. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for 2 classes and a Champion/Reserve will be provided.

The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Thoroughbred Suitable Jumper II (2'9")**. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for 2 classes and a Champion/Reserve will be provided.

The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Thoroughbred Schooling Jumper III (3'0"\*)**. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for 2 classes and a Champion/Reserve will be provided.

The Jockey Club T.I.P. **Thoroughbred Training Jumper (3'3")**. Ribbons for 1st through 6th place for 2 classes and a Champion/Reserve will be provided.
